Noted:

NUS Extra Cards

Noted:

- Everyone promoted NUS Extra cards during Fresher's Week, and smashed NUS sales compared to the same time last year.
- A single form has been created to incorporate 'Give Back Days'
- Target for NUS Extra Card sales is 3000, and cards are valid for 12 months from the date of purchase

4. Student Council/Executive Committee reporting and relationship Noted:

- Student Council Chair John Fernandez advised members of Exec' that he wished to see Student Council back up and running as the accountability power it can be.
- No policy has been put through Student Council in the last two years
- Student Council is looking at putting through a referendum on a 'smoke free campus'
- Student can hold members of the Executive Committee to account at Student Council meetings, and all members of Exec' are encouraged to all attend
- Student Council training is taking place on Friday 5 October 2012, from 12 noon until 2.00 pm on The Platform in the Engine Shed

5. Student Feedback from GOATing

Noted:

- Timetabling on Wednesday afternoons is clashing with some matches
- University policy states that there should not be any compulsory lecturers timetabled after 1.00 pm on Wednesdays

- Evidence to be gathered and a proposal put together to take to a future meeting of the Student Experience Committee

Noted:

 There has been lack of guidance on dissertations in some areas, with some students not receiving information until returning after the summer break

 VP Academic Affairs Wesley Wells to pursue placing generic dissertation guidance and information on courses on Blackboard, via the library

Timetabling

Noted:

 A number of students, including postgraduates have experienced timetabling issues, including double bookings, late changes and non enrolment on some modules

International Students

Noted:

 An issue was highlighted about ERASMUS students. As they are considered to be 'home' students they are not currently supported by the International Office

Action:

Library PC's

Noted:

- A few teething problems have been encountered with the new software, and some initial log-ons have been slow but have been quick thereafter
- Students are to ensure that they have downloaded everything from the 'Cloud'
- Individual desk spaces are now available upstairs, which are awaiting electrical connections; but this is expected to be completed by November 2012
